Academic Performance of S6 Students (2015-16)

Our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2016 HKDSE. 88.5% (139) of our students met the basic entrance requirement for admission to publicly-funded undergraduate programmes (33222), well above the territory-wide day school figure (42.0%).

A special mention is given to Parky Chan (6F), who achieved a top score of <u>six 5**, one 5* and</u> <u>one 5</u>.
