One student achieved a top score of six 5**, and two 5* and eighteen students had scores of best five subjects being 29 or above. 89% (114) of students received offers in the JUPAS. There were 23 students admitted to HKU, 23 admitted to CUHK, 2 admitted to HKUST, and 33 admitted to degree programmes of other publicly funded universities.

Our school's achievements do not come easily. Students and teachers put every effort into maintaining the invaluable reputation of the school. A strong teacher-student rapport is a core and essential element to nurture our students with a great sense of belonging to the school. The drive for excellence permeates deeply into our school culture. As the principal of Ho Fung College, I will continue to inherit the past and to maintain the core values of our school. 

Academic Performance of S6 Students (2016-2017)







English Learning

Learning English seems a tedious process: memorizing grammatical patterns, mastering a vast variety of vocabulary and perfecting pronunciation. Ho Fung, through its various enriching programs, has nevertheless made the process a more enjoyable one.

On a daily basis, we are given a multitude of chances to practise the language. From politics to everyday life, we freely express our opinions and engage in real communication during and after class through inclass debate, frequent oral presentations, etc. Besides presenting in front of the class, we give announcements and speeches on moral values and current issues to the whole school in weekly morning assemblies. The school further nurtures language learners through extra courses in writing and speaking, taught by experienced teachers, in order to hone our language skills.

In addition to the learning opportunities offered by the school, the English Society boasts a diverse range of fun events to educate, engage and entertain our fellow students, namely our English Weeks, with activities like dramas, poem recitations, song dedications, tongue twisters, and best of all, game stalls designed and hosted by students ourselves. We play games to earn prizes while using the language with a natural, friendly ambience. With enthusiastic feedback, these events prove that our learning environment does stimulate and motivate students to learn the second language well.

After participating in a lot of activities at school, I believe learning through activities is more effective than merely lecturing. Last year, everyone in our school took part in the annual English Week. Game stalls, Scramble games, spelling and tongue twister competitions - and the list goes on – aroused students' interest in English language. Outside school, I, attended choral speaking competitions, and presented poems with lively movements and organised voices with some S2 girls, as well as a group of S3 students. The practice which lasted for weeks surely improved our pronunciation and confidence, and we were thrilled to know both teams took victory on the same day! Another time, our class watched an unusual play, or more precisely, 'joined' a play. The cast invited our classmates to act with them and taught us some vocabulary in an engaging way, before leading us to the theatre where we had to walk to different stage settings and watched the drama. It is true that learning itself can be demanding, but these experiences certainly open us up to new interests and outstanding academic achievements.



Teaching and Learning: Self-regulated Learning

The self-regulated learning initiative has been established as part of the school's drive to nurture the skills and competencies of our teaching staff and students. In the year of 2012-13, a number of our teachers participated in the field trip to Shandong, where they enhanced their understanding of the self-regulated learning approach and shared their skills and knowledge with fellow teachers in the region and across schools sponsored by Sik Sik Yuen.

Providing fruitful exposure, experience and exchange, the initiative has been launched in junior forms across subjects from 2013 onwards. Students' confidence has been boosted through giving presentations and leading discussions in class. Self-regulated learning has now become a pedagogical approach that our teachers constantly adopt in lessons of various subjects.





Teaching and Learning: STEM Education
