In 2014, the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region launched the Multi-faceted Excellence Scholarship (MES) to those HKDSE candidates exceling in sports, arts and / or community service. It aims to promote a culture of multi-faceted excellence and convey to society the message that academic results are not the sole criterion for measuring the success of young people. In the first year the scholarship was launched, the annual quota of the MES was about 20 and our 2015 S6 graduate, LAU KIT HUNG, was one of the students to receive the scholarship to study Social Sciences at the Chinese University of Hong Kong with tuition wavier for her 4-year programme. In a bid to further promote multi-faceted excellence, the government has decided to double the annual quota of the MES from around 20 to around 40 starting from 2018. Our current S6 graduate KU CHI TING did very well in the HKDSE with 4 subjects being 5**, 3 subjects 5* and 1 subjects 5 and was admitted to the Faculty of Medicine of HKU.

Over the years, one of the goals of our school is to provide students with quality all-round education, to nurture their charitable and social spirit so as to contribute to society in the future.

School Profile (2018-2019)

Principal's Message

The scholarships presented to LAU KIT HUNG and KU CHI TING fully illustrate the successes of Ho Fung in providing all-round education to our students. Ho Fung always takes various measures to equip our students with the 3As – 'able to learn', 'able to do' and 'able to engage' with the ultimate goal of having our students to have whole person development.

It's my belief that schooling should be education both inside and outside classroom, and whole person development should always come first. Since I took up the principalship at Ho Fung in 2012, I have been making a lot of changes based on this. These include changes in school administration, curriculum, teachers' development, student allocation, student assessment, support for student development, CCA arrangement, award and punishment schemes. These changes are fully supported by the school's stakeholders and our school's self-evaluation indicates that these changes have quite positive effect.

In November 2017, Ho Fung underwent the external school review (ESR) by Education Bureau to validate the school's self-evaluation and its impact on the school's development. The oral feedback by the ESR was encouraging with very positive comments on:

- 1. school leadership and various changes taken,
- 2. school self-evaluation,
- 3. curriculum development,
- 4. teaching strategies and arrangements,
- 5. learning and teaching effectiveness,
- 6. student support,
- 7. student life planning education and
- 8. student performance.

The ESR team leader said both teachers and students are very proud of the school and have a strong sense of belonging. She expressed very high appreciation to various achievements of Ho Fung in various aspects. All the team members felt the warmth of Ho Fung and enjoyed working in our school.

The comments in the official ESR report received in March 2018 are as follows:

- * The school leaders are enterprising and embrace change. The school Principal has clear goals, strong leadership, and can lead the school in all aspects of development. Pleasing outcomes are brought along with changes promulgated by the Principal.
- * All teachers contribute to the school selfevaluation process. The school is reflective in enhancing its continuous development. Constant reviews are made in achieving the targets set.
- * Major Review Emphasis (MRE) of Secondary School Education are suitably incorporated in school curriculum to achieve the targets set in school's major concerns. The school actively

- promotes e-learning so as to enhance the quality of teaching and enable students to learn effectively.
- * Curriculum reviews and strategies to cater for learner diversity have positive impact on student learning.
- * Students have good learning attitudes and high learning abilities.
- * Measures are well in place to develop students' positive values and attitude. Greater emphasis has been put to help students develop a more balanced outlook on learning.
- * Life planning education enables students' better understanding of themselves in both academic and career pursuits. Students' voices are heard and properly addressed.
- * Students are benevolent and committed to learning. They perform well in both academic and non-academic aspects. There is a continuous improvement of students' performance in the HKDSE examinations.

The ESR is a comprehensive review of a school's work and changes since 2012. In the future, the school will strike for further improvement in various aspects through continuous self-reflection. Strategies will be formulated according to the recommendations of the ESR report to enhance e-learning and students' self-regulated learning. I am confident that all teachers and students will continue to support the school's future changes and various enhancement measures to pursuit excellence.




figure (42.0%). A special mention is given to Ku Chi Ting (6D), who achieved a top score of four 5^{**} , and three 5^{*} . Students with three or more subjects attaining 5^{*} or 5^{**} are as follows:




