Under the guiding principle of our school motto, "To act benevolently and to teach benevolence", Ho Fung College has been prestigious in Hong Kong for forty-five years since its establishment in 1974 characterized by providing a wide range of learning opportunities to students for their whole person development, developing their sheer passion and dedication to society and broadening their exposure in a culturally diverse and rich environment.

Our academic results are always a testament to students' hard work and dedication as well as the high level of commitment of our staff. This year, our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2019 HKDSE examinations with a remarkable percentage of students attaining the basic entrance requirement for admission to publicly-funded undergraduate programmes (33222). A special mention must be given to Wong Yin Tung (6D), who achieved a top score

of five 5**, two 5* and one 5. Our English Debate Team swept the board at the 34th Sing Tao Inter-school English Debating Competition, Hong Kong Secondary Schools English Debating Competitions and HKPTU Inter-school English Debating Competitions. Our Chinese Debate Team was crowned the Overall Champion and N.T. West Champion at the 7th Inter-school Debating Competition, and Overall First Runner-up at the 18th Basic Law Cup (Mandarin). Lee Long Ting (3D) and Lee Man Ki (3D) won the Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing Outstanding Student Awards 2019 (Junior Forms), not to mention other numerous awards and prizes received by our talented students at different levels. Our students' potential has been thoroughly achieved with exciting breakthroughs in different perspectives. The dedication of staff is vital to our success in the





students' whole person development.

We always encourage our students to become responsible members in Hong Kong community by nurturing their positive attitudes and paying attention to the social development. This year, Tsui Tsz Hin (5C) won the Outstanding Student Leaders Award 2018-19 organized by Hok Yau Club. Volunteer work is also organized for students. Through a string of experiential learning activities, students are able to take a proactive approach to unleash their potential, enhance their competitiveness and seize every opportunity to achieve their goals.

Exposure to the world is said to be the most successful learning mechanism

for all learning types. A school trip can provide students with endless opportunities to improve their personal development. This year, different study tours were organized for students, such as An Exploration into the History, Culture and Economic Development of Harbin, the 5-Day Historical and Cultural Ecology Conservation of Fukuoka, and the 5-Day Leadership Training Programme in Taipei. These travel experiences extend students' world knowledge and expand students' world view, as they experience a new way of life and have a better understanding of the people, history and culture of the city or country they visit.

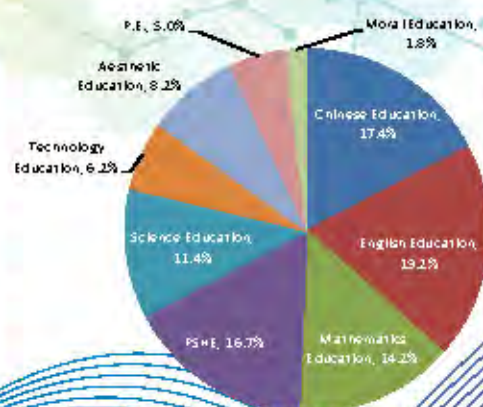

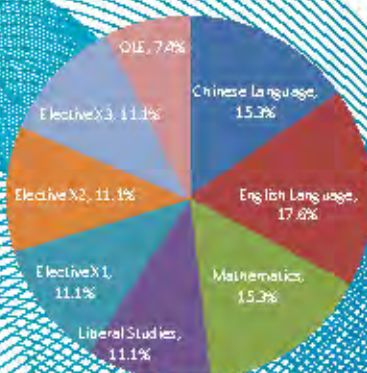

Academic Performance of S6 Students (2018-19)

Our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2019 HKDSE. 83.7% (103) of our students met the basic entrance requirement for admission to publicly-funded undergraduate programmes (33222), well above the territory-wide day school figure (42.1%). A

special mention is given to Wong Yin Tung (6D), who achieved a top score of five 5**, two 5* and one 5. The results of the best 12 performing students with 28 marks or above (best 5) are as follows:

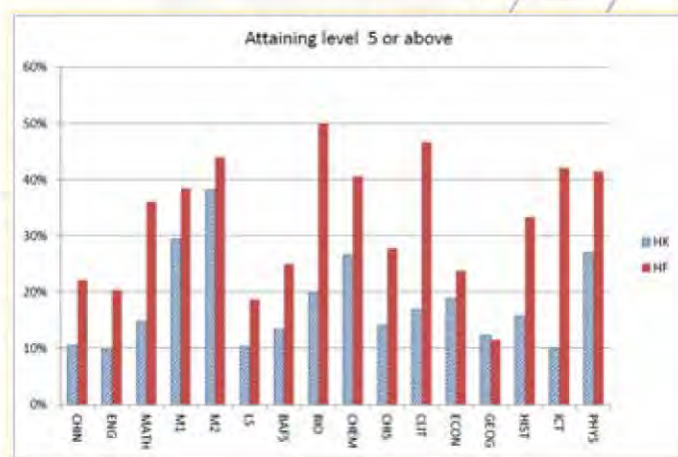
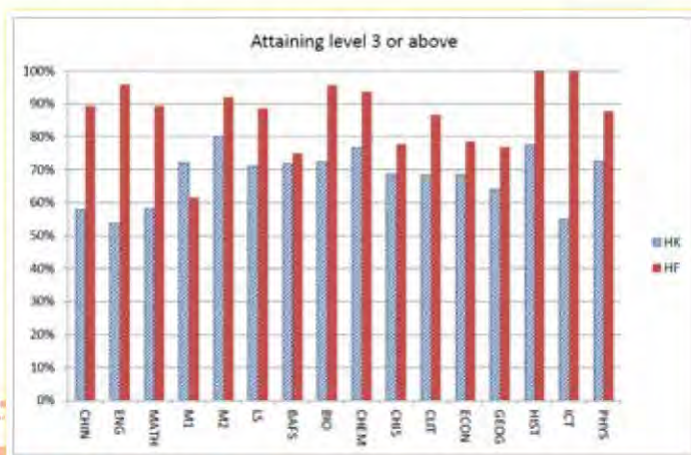

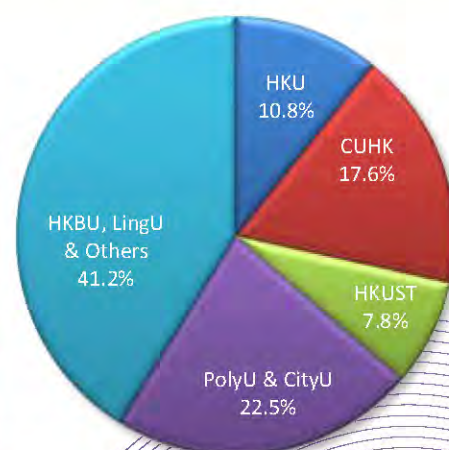
