Our Chinese Debate Team was crowned the Overall Champion and N.T. West Champion at the 7th Inter-school Debating Competition, and Overall First Runnerup at the 18th Basic Law Cup (Mandarin). Lee Long Ting (3D) and Lee Man Ki (3D) won the Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing Outstanding Student Awards 2019 (Junior Forms), not to mention other numerous awards and prizes received by our talented students at different levels. Our students' potential has been thoroughly achieved with exciting breakthroughs in different perspectives. The dedication of staff is vital to our success in the





students' whole person development.

We always encourage our students to become responsible members in Hong Kong community by nurturing their positive attitudes and paying attention to the social development. This year, Tsui Tsz Hin (5C) won the Outstanding Student Leaders Award 2018-19 organized by Hok Yau Club. Volunteer work is also organized for students. Through a string of experiential learning activities, students are able to take a proactive approach to unleash their potential, enhance their competitiveness and seize every opportunity to achieve their goals.

Exposure to the world is said to be the most successful learning mechanism



Academic Performance of S6 Students (2018-19)

Our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2019 HKDSE. 83.7% (103) of our students met the basic entrance requirement for admission to publiclyfunded undergraduate programmes (33222), well above the territory-wide day school figure (42.1%). A special mention is given to Wong Yin Tung (6D), who achieved a top score of five 5**, two 5* and one 5. 



