

Our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2020 HKDSE. 92.6% (113) of our students met the basic entrance requirement for admission to publicly-funded undergraduate programmes (33222), well above the territory-wide day school figure (42.1%). A special mention is given to Chan Chun Hei (6D), who achieved a top score of five 5**, two 5* and one 5. 
Impressively, the percentage of students attaining level 4 and level 5 far surpasses the territory percentage.

Here at Ho Fung College we have been exploring every opportunity to create a stimulating English environment that prepares students for the future.

S2 & S4 English Drama Education

Biweekly English drama courses, part of the English Language curriculum and aesthetic development curriculum we offer to S2 and S4 students respectively, allow an avenue to celebrate the richness and depth of verbal and facial expressions in rehearsals in classrooms and performances on stage.

STEM Essence

Starting from the academic year 2018-2019, a slot of STEM education has been allocated in their regular timetable for all S1 Hofungers. By identifying a daily life problem and devising a solution using microcontrollers, students learn coding, circuitry, mathematics and computational skills.


