

Academic Performance of 86 Students (2021-22)

Our students once again reaped impressive results in the 2022 HKDSE. 91.7% (99) of our students met the basic entrance requirement for admission to publicly-funded undergraduate programmes (33222), well above the territory-wide day school figure (41.9%). A special mention is given to Shum Fai Yiu (6D), who achieved a top score of five 5**, one 5* and two 5. The results of the best 23 performing students with 2 or more subjects attaining level 5* or above are as follows:




